## **REFURBISHING ST MARK'S FOR A NEW ERA**

St Mark's was consecrated in July 1879, so we are approaching the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of worshippers gathering in our buildings. 2025 is the year we will start making some changes to the church and community centre so that our values of belonging, believing and becoming are more physically apparent to everyone who visits. The project will happen in phases, and some of the professional work to be done includes:

- ❖ The drains, gutters and downpipes will be repaired or renewed to prevent further water damage to the walls and interior.
- The south doors near Rugby Road will be improved with better wheelchair access, including electric doors and a new ramp. External lighting will be improved.
- The community centre will receive new signage and electric doors, a new flat roof in places, and repaired roofing in others. New windows will be installed in the hall and security will be improved.
- Lighting and sound will be improved in the church and community centre to ensure everyone can hear and see, and so that we are as eco-friendly as possible.
- ❖ Work to the exterior will be done to ensure the stability of the bricks, and the east window will be guarded against damage.
- And lots more...

St Mark's is a place to belong, and these changes will ensure that future generations of people can continue to find sanctuary within our walls and be served by our buildings.

**February 2025** will be an indoor DIY month – we are looking for people who can take on small tasks that will make sure that we are ready for the big changes to come. There are loads of different tasks; from putting wheels on sofas to sweeping the clock chamber, so whether you're a beginner or an expert, you can help!
