Prayer at St Mark's

Prayer is an important part of our lives as Christians – although not necessarily an easy one.

Asking for prayer for ourselves - or those close to us is one aspect and we are hoping to make this easier.

There are several options:

- 1. After the morning service on Sundays (except all-age services). Members of our prayer ministry team are available to pray with and for you.
- 2. Through a note in the prayer box at the back of church. Leave as much or little information as you feel comfortable, it can be anonymous or just your name; and we will pass it on to the prayer team.
- 3. By emailing <u>prayer@st-marks.net</u> Your request will then be passed on to the team, again you can give as much or as little information as you wish.
- 4. There is opportunity to share prayer requests at the evening service and in small groups.

Prayer and prayer ministry teams are known and trusted members of our congregation who have appropriate safeguarding training. Confidentiality will be assured – within the safeguarding boundaries.

If you would like to be part of the prayer team (to receive emailed prayer requests), or part of the prayer ministry team (for after service prayer – this is on a rota basis and usually works out at one Sunday a month for 2 out of every 3 months) please contact the office.

A Quote from Paula Gooder's book 'Phoebe' (A story inspired by Romans). "Prayer isn't like giving in your order for hot food: submitted one moment and delivered the next. But prayer does place us in God's presence. Prayer opens us up to see what God is already doing.

Prayer invites God to be present at the heart of what we're worried about.

"What if we're not sure what to ask?" ... "When we do not know how to pray as we ought the Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words." Yes, ... We can let the Spirit ask for us." After several years of only routine or essential maintenance we have lots of exciting plans and ideas for the church itself and the community centre. These vary from basic DIY (eg replacing locks on toilet doors) to major projects (eg. new flat roof for the community centre and disabled ramp for the south door); some have been approved by the PCC and we have architect plans, others are further down the line.
